Glamorgan through its CEO Dan Cherry have been very supportive of the idea. They are offering reduced price (£7) tickets if bought in advance and children to be admitted free of charge.

The club is intending to put on some scheduled and bookable community cricket activities on the out- field in the breaks and on the lawn to help drive attendance from families. It is hoped that children and families involved in the club's All stars and Dynamo projects will take advantage of this opportunity to watch overseas stars Marnus Labuschagne and Colin Ingram play alongside their teammates including the captain and record-breaking run scorer Sam Northeast, in form Mason Crane and local boy Kiran Carlson in the longer format of the game.

County cricket is the most personal form of the game for all the family, with children having easy access for autographs and the ability to play on an international ground during the intervals. This is the opportunity of a bargain not to be missed!!

Dan Cherry said "We are very happy to support this new initiative and hope that it is able to establish itself as an annual event in the cricket calendar. It would be fantastic to see engagement from our local community groups, families and others from further afield who can take advantage of our offer and support this exciting day of cricket."

David Griffiths, the Glamorgan representative on the CCMG is hopeful that cricket fans will support this day. "I am delighted with Glamorgan's positive response to the idea of County cricket day and have taken on the 23<sup>rd</sup> June as their opportunity to become involved. The club has been very unlucky with the weather recently having the international match between England and Pakistan abandoned together with the latest T20 match. It now is vital that members and the wider community get behind this venture and support Glamorgan".
